The library catalog identifies government documents in Criss Library

Connect to the library catalog at <http://catalog.lib.unomaha.edu>. Click the *Advanced Search* link, select *U.S. Docs* in the *Limit to location* dropdown menu, and then enter a keyword search with results restricted to United States documents. You may also enter keyword searches that specify the word *Nebraska* as a subject or author word to identify State of Nebraska documents.
