

The UNO University Library has three statistical indexes, all published by the same company, the Congressional Information Service (CIS). These are the *American Statistics Index (ASI)*, the *Statistical Reference Index (SRI)*, and the *Index to International Statistics (IIS)*.

- *ASI* indexes statistics generated by all branches and agencies of the United States government 1974 - 2001. **Index HA37.U55 A5**
- *SRI* indexes statistics produced by U.S. state government agencies, commercial enterprises, associations, independent research centers and universities 1980 to the present. **Index HA37.U55 S79**
- *IIS* indexes statistics generated by the United Nations system and international intergovernmental organizations. UNO owns 1992-1998. Some of the organizations included besides the United Nations are the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development, the European Union and Organization of American States. **Index HA155.I53**

### To search these indexes:

1. Start with the **Index** volume.
2. Write down the accession number for the document wanted. **Examples: 2042-4.704 S2680-1** Accession numbers for the current year usually begin with a number in parentheses to correspond with the paperback **Abstract** issue where the entry is located. **Example: (3) 1804-24**
3. Go to the **Abstract** volume and locate the document abstract using the accession number.
4. Read the document abstract for relevance, writing down the page number(s) in the document where the needed information is located, if page numbers are given.
5. Before leaving the Abstract volume to find the document, be sure to write down its call number. See examples below.

### ASI. There are two possible call numbers and locations.

1. If the document abstract contains a solid black dot (next to *Item*), the document is a documents call number, which is the number with the small open circle in front of it.  
Example:     ○HE24.1:991.  
Go to the Documents Department on the first floor to retrieve the document
2. If the document abstract does *not* contain a black dot, the document should be available on microfiche. Write down the accession number and the name and date of the index.  
Example:     **ASI** 1993 4584-10.  
Go to the first floor and locate the document in the cabinets labeled **ASI**.

### SRI and IIS:

1. Write down the accession number and name and date of index as for **ASI** above.  
Example:     **SRI** 1993 S2680-1.2.
2. Go to the first floor and locate the documents in the microfiche cabinets labeled **SRI**. If the document is not available on microfiche, try looking it up in UNO's **Library Catalog**.
